3. Teaching Process

In classes Nur. to V school continued with LEAD Schools for conceptual teaching and experiential learning was adopted. As per this curriculum in 40 Minutes period 20 minutes were used for concept explanation through video, audio and TLM. 10 minutes were used for group practice to enhance conceptual understanding with the peers and last 10 minutes were used for individual practice where students try to write answers in their own words through what they had understood. After completion of each unit assessments were taken.

In classes VI to XII school worked for Holistic Development of the students. Various worksheets were provided to the students for enhancing their problem solving skill & Critical thinking skill. School held various Competitions and academic activities for go beyond the text books and the classrooms, encourage and foster a healthy competitive spirit and effective communication skills in the students.

English, Science, Maths and Finance Olympiads were conducted this year and the students perform excellently at the school level.

Value based education is given for self-development and personality development. This is done with the aim to inculcate in students' values like honesty, gratitude, forgiveness, kindness etc.

5. Co-Curriculum Activities

School activities play a significant part in the development of students. Co-curricular activities have become a fundamental part of school life and aides in improving students learning at school.
